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

Human Rights Day commemorates the anniversary of one of the world's most groundbreaking global pledges: the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR).</p>	<p>Town Hall / Forum Youth-Led Human Rights Forum Organize an event where young people can discuss human rights issues, share personal stories, and present ideas for fostering inclusivity and equality in their city—highlighting the importance of child rights.</p> <p>Workshop / Training Art & Storytelling Showcase Host an exhibit or creative workshop where youth can express their perspectives on human rights through art, writing, or performance, centered around themes from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Youth could take part in the planning and execution of the event, helping with logistics and engaging with other teens about available mental health resources. JUNE 11, 2026 International Day of Play: Celebrate children's fundamental right to engage in play!	<p>Event / Celebration</p> <p>Youth-Led Play Advocacy Event: Host a gathering where youth discuss the importance of play and how it can improve their communities. They can share ideas on creating more inclusive play spaces and ensuring that recreational activities are accessible to children and youth of all abilities. Youth could also work together to create a petition or advocacy message to present to local leaders, highlighting the need for more support for safe, inclusive, and accessible play in the community.</p> <p>Service Project / Services</p> <p>Creative Play Stations: Set up interactive play stations throughout local parks or community centers, where youth can engage in hands-on activities such as building obstacle courses with natural materials, participating in arts and crafts, or designing their own games.
