A global citizen is someone who understands global interconnectivity, respects and values diversity, has the ability to challenge injustice and inequalities; and takes action in a way that is personally meaningful.

The U.S. Fund for UNICEF Global Citizenship Fellowship is a highly competitive, full-time, two year program that prepares diverse, committed and globally minded individuals for effective leadership in public service. There are 18 Global Citizenship Fellows: 12 serve as grassroots and national spokespersons for children and 6 focus on specific programs; UNICEF Campus Initiative, High School Clubs, Constituent

Engagement, the End Trafficking Project and UNICEF Next Generation.

Global Citizenship Fellows are grassroots spokespeople for the U.S. Fund for UNICEF. Fellows bring together networks of volunteers, faith-based communities, schools, universities, advocates, elected leaders and others to work toward educating, advocating and fundraising for UNICEF's global work of putting children first. ■
