Make an Impact

UNICEF has helped save more children's lives than any other humanitarian organization.

\$1 could provide 40 days of safe water for a child.

\$5 could provide a malnourished child with therapeutic food for at least three days.

\$10 could vaccinate 54 children and save them from a life-threatening disease.

\$250 could provide 50 vaccines and 1 customized School-in-a-Box kit for 40 students.

\$500 could provide two adolescent kits packed with puzzles, art materials and games to help up to 100 young people express their emotions, as well as develop life skills, in the aftermath of conflict or disaster. The kit uses arts, innovation and adolescent-led projects and is designed to be flexible and easily adapted to the capacities, interests and priorities of the adolescents who are using it.

\$1,000 could provide 4 Early Childhood Development Kits benefiting up to 200 children during a crisis.

\$2,000 could provide a durable tent large enough to operate health services, feeding and operations centers and temporary schools, and protect supplies.

\$5,000 could provide 1,000 fleece blankets to be used in hospitals and health centers or distributed among the needy refugees.

\$10,000 could provide family water kits for 655 families in the aftermath of a natural disaster, like an earthquake. These kits provide

essential supplies such as collapsible water containers, buckets, soap and water purification tablets to restore access to safe, clean water.

\$15,000 could provide reading and math textbooks for 2,035 elementary school children in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

\$25,000 could provide eight motorcycle ambulances. Able to travel both on and off-road, motorcycles can transport essential staff and an impressive amount of supplies reliably, quickly and at low cost to areas difficult to reach. ●
